ADMINISTRATION

Recruits

Between January and April 2007, the GVTA Police Service has hired 12 recruits and 3 experienced police officers, and remains on target for the 2007 hiring requirements.

Transfers and Promotions

The recent promotional process and position competitions have resulted in the following:

- Transit Centre Liaison Officer Supervisor – Sergeant John Mills
- Patrol Squad Supervisor – Sergeant Dale Hemm
- Professional Standards Unit Officer (new) – Sergeant Wayne Cope
- Community/Media/Intel Liaison Officer (new) – Sergeant Willie Merenick
- Operations Support Sergeant (new) – Sergeant Jason White.

Staffing of the new positions will greatly assist the GVTA Police Service in advancing organizational development and operational capacity.

Training Highlights

In March, police supervisors received training on use of the Mobile Data Terminals (MDTs) now mounted in police operational vehicles. In April, three GVTA Police Service Members commenced an intensive Use of Force Instructor course at the Justice Institute of British Columbia. Two GVTA Police Service supervisors attended a social change and policing course in Victoria. Eight senior staff and supervisors recently completed a strategic thinking course as a leadership development initiative of Acting Chief Officer Allen. A Vancouver Police Department Drug Section officer delivered two training sessions to GVTA Police Members, covering the following topics: drug identification & paraphernalia, Detention versus Arrest and how to articulate, what to look for when establishing grounds, and handling and tagging of exhibits.

OPERATIONS

SkyTrain Attendant Presentations

In an effort to bring greater understanding to the SkyTrain Attendants of the Greater Vancouver Transportation Authority Police Service role as a Designated Policing Unit, Acting Inspector McKillican – Operations Division prepared a four-part presentation. Over the past two months, A/Inspector McKillican, Acting Staff Sergeant Semple and Constables Merkel, Gladwin, Rasmussen, Klassen and Chartrand have delivered 32 presentations, reaching 186 SkyTrain Attendants. The four-part presentation included:

- Part 1 – Structure of the GVTA Police Service, including identifying governance, jurisdiction and mandate.
- Part 2 – In-depth look at the GVTA Conduct and Safety Regulations, the obligations of clientele using the system, the authorities provided to Transit Employees and, in particular, the proper process to be followed when issuing a Denial of Access.
- Part 3 – Scope of the *Safe Streets Act* and amendments being explored for application in SkyTrain environment.
- Part 4 – Description of offence types that the GVTA Police Service Members often investigate on SkyTrain – highlighting the primary concern for the safety of personnel and clientele. Insight also provided on ways and means by which transit personnel can assist GVTA Police in the containment of a crime scene, the chain of evidence and identification of witnesses and victims.

There was tremendous interest by the SkyTrain Attendants in the presentation content and most sessions went longer than anticipated with questions and discussion. The GVTA Police Service welcomed the opportunity to strengthen its working relationship with the SkyTrain Attendants and believes the information exchange will enhance cooperation and communication, and service delivery to the traveling public. The GVTA Police Service appreciates the support by managers at the BC Rapid Transit Company for the initiative.

Incidents

The following are illustrations of recent incidents involving GVTA Police response or assistance to other police agencies.

1. At Gateway SkyTrain Station a male was causing a disturbance. GVTA Police checked the subject and it was found that the subject had a bulletproof vest on. The subject was detained for causing a disturbance. A struggle occurred as the second GVTA Police Member assisted. A loaded restricted handgun was found on the subject as well as other bullets in pockets. The subject was on conditions of no possess firearms and had an outstanding charge of possession of a restricted weapon. The subject was transported to Surrey RCMP cells. (GV2007-2884)

2. GVTA Police were on routine foot patrol of the Lougheed SkyTrain Station and received a report that a male matching the description of a suspect in a Burnaby bank robbery was on an eastbound SkyTrain from Brentwood SkyTrain Station. GVTA Police intercepted the SkyTrain and located the suspect. Burnaby RCMP arrived and confirmed that the person intercepted was the robbery suspect. During the arrest, the suspect fled the platform with police in foot pursuit. One GVTA Police Member lost his footing on the escalator and received injuries. The other police on the scene located the suspect across the street with the money/hold-up note, and Burnaby RCMP arrested the suspect for robbery. The GVTA Police Member requires surgery and remains on medical leave. (GV2007-2884)
3. A SkyTrain Attendant observed a male loading and brandishing a handgun in the area of the New Westminster SkyTrain Station. The subject was then observed putting the handgun down his pants and left the area with three other people. GVTA Police arrived and pursued the subject. When approached by GVTA Police, the subject dropped what was later determined to be a replica "Movie Gun" on the sidewalk as he attempted to move away. A search incident to arrest resulted in seizure of 8 pieces of crack cocaine and a small flap of heroin. New Westminster Police backed up GVTA Police on the file. The subject was charged with possession. Drugs were also found on one other in the group. (GV2007-2962)
4. A robbery occurred in the Metrotown area in which two victims had the items stolen from them at knifepoint, and violence occurred after the theft. Later in the day at the Surrey Central SkyTrain Station, the victims of the robbery approached a GVTA Police Member and pointed out the five suspects of the robbery. GVTA Police followed the suspects from the SkyTrain Station to the nearby mall. GVTA Police caught up with the suspects, and after questioning the suspects arrested. Robbery charges are pending. (GV2007-3247)
5. New Westminster Police contacted the GVTA Police Service requesting assistance for an impaired driver that fled from a multiple vehicle injury motor vehicle accident. The suspect was last seen fleeing towards the New Westminster SkyTrain Station. The Acting Staff Sergeant made both foot and vehicle patrols around the Station, and then widened his search for the suspect (who was possibly bleeding). The Acting Staff Sergeant located the suspect entering a local restaurant, and the suspect showed signs of intoxication. The Acting Staff Sergeant apprehended the suspect. Both New Westminster Police and GVTA Police attended the scene and the suspect transported to New Westminster police cells. (GV2007-3511)

Transit Centre Liaison Officer Unit

Over the past two months, the Transit Centre Liaison Officer Unit (seven Members) continue to be engaged in a variety of police work related to the safety and security of bus and West Coast Express passengers and transit personnel. Recent examples include: Port Haney West Coast Express Station traffic enforcement (e.g., parking violations, no-seatbelts); investigation underway of male exposing himself to passengers on bus to Richmond (Vancouver and New Westminster Police Departments advised of file); two investigations concerning threats made against Bus Operators; assist to Surrey RCMP with foot patrols of Newton Loop and one male arrested for Outstanding Warrant for trafficking in controlled substance; bus lane enforcement at King George SkyTrain Station; and assist to Coast Mountain Bus Company at Broadway and Cambie Street to enable safe and efficient bus movement which has been impacted by the major re-route of traffic from Canada Line construction (A GVTA police operations plan was completed and forwarded to Vancouver Police Traffic Section prior to commencement of the initiative).

Statistics

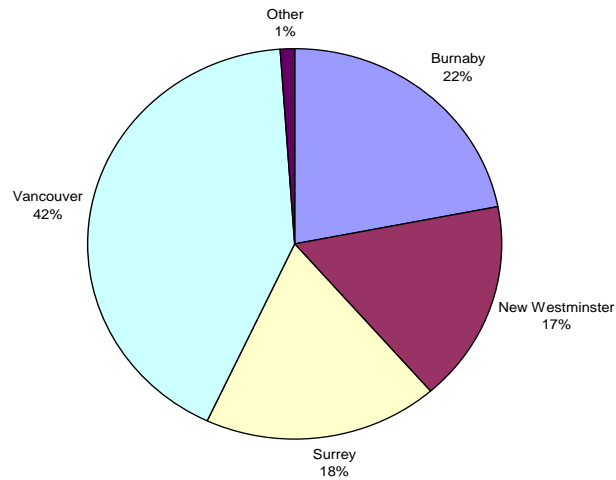
The 2007 first quarter statistical summary is provided in Appendix A. (These statistics only count the primary/first Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Offence. There can be up to four offences per General Occurrence or Incident.) In the first quarter there were two GOs created with the Warrant Executed as the primary offence (as reflected in the Appendix A). However, with all offences counted, the GVTA Police Service Members executed a total of 95 RCMP Outstanding Warrants and 79 Outstanding Warrants for Municipal Police Forces (total 174).

In 2006, the GVTA Police Service requested PRIME to include UCR codes specific to the Greater Vancouver Transportation Authority Act – Greater Vancouver Transit Conduct and Safety Regulation. Accordingly, 6 different extensions were added to the 7250 UCR code: Require to Pay Fare, Fare Paid Zone, Payment Not Transfer, Property Access, Public Safety and Property, and Fail to Obey. Commencing January 2007, the GVTA Police Service implemented use of this code and extensions to replace use of 7300-24 (Other Provincial Statutes). The new UCR code provides more accurate and useful information on GVTA Police Service enforcement regarding the *GVTA Act* – Greater Vancouver Transit Conduct and Safety Regulation. There also was a new UCR code – 8120.26 added to track denial of access to the transit system (e.g., 24 hour refusal).

The majority of GVTA Police work continues to focus on the SkyTrain system. During the 2007 first quarter the majority of police General Occurrence files were generated from policing on SkyTrain Station properties (January 89%, February 91%, March 89%).

In 2006, the GVTA Police Service received 9,921 Calls for Service. Jurisdictional breakdown is provided below. (*Note: This total excludes jurisdictional police “Be On Lookout” and SkyTrain Attendant Denial of Access – which are not classified as calls for service.*)

OTHER

Complaints

During the period January 1, 2007 to March 31, 2007, the Police Service has opened 6 complaint files. 3 files are formal lodged complaints under the *Police Act*, and 3 files are non-lodged complaints. The three lodged complaints involve four allegations: Abuse of Authority (3) and Discreditable Conduct (1). All of the files are active. The new Professional Standards Unit Sergeant is now in place and dedicated space for the Unit is included in the 713 Columbia police facility under renovation.

Community Meeting

The GVTA Police Service was invited to attend a meeting of the Kingsway Imperial Neighbourhood Association (KINA) in Burnaby. Acting Staff Sergeant Semple and Constables Henyecz and Doyon represented the Police Service. The purpose of this meeting was to bring stakeholders together to discuss issues of concern and identify a means of developing a strategy to mitigate these problems. Approximately 80 citizens from the area were in attendance. Acting Staff Sergeant Semple provided a brief presentation on the GVTA Police Service mandate as well as a breakdown on calls for service and how that related to the Burnaby area. Other speakers included Inspector Wood and Sergeant Carr – Burnaby RCMP, Mayor Corrigan – City of Burnaby and two Members of the BC Legislative Assembly. Members of Burnaby City Council were also in the audience.
